The South Plains College nursing program has successfully graduated many nurses that serve our local healthcare community. The RN program is a two-year degree plan. The LVN or Paramedic to RN Bridging Transition program is a three-semester program. Students that successfully complete the Associate Nursing Degree (Registered Nurse) or (Bridging Transition) program are then eligible to apply to take the State Board Exam (NCLEX) for Registered Nurse Licensure.

Admission to the college does not guarantee admission to the Associate Degree Nursing programs

- O Have a minimum prerequisites GPA of 2.6 or better. **

Additional requirements for the Associate Degree Nursing Bridging Transition program (LVN or Paramedic TO RN)

- O Have a minimum cumulative GPA and prerequisite GPA of 2.7 or better. **
- O Have a minimum of 1 year experience working as a LVN or Paramedic.

** If prerequisite GPA is below the requirement a conditional acceptance may be granted. The admission committee will review individual applications for potential acceptance.

Prerequisites for the Associate Degree Nursing Registered Nurse (RN) program:

- ✓ **English 1301** must be completed with a "C" or better before applying for the nursing program.
- Anatomy & Physiology 1 (Biol 2401) must be completed with a "C" or better before applying for the nursing program. *
- ✓ Anatomy & Physiology 2 (Biol 2402) must be completed with a "C" or better. A&P2 can be enrolled in during the application cycle. Course must be successfully completed by the end of the application cycle semester. *
 - * Science prerequisites A&P1 (Biol 2401) & A&P2 (Biol 2402) must NOT have more than 1 "C" in the courses.
 - * Anatomy & Physiology courses expire after 5 years. Failed Anatomy & Physiology courses may only be repeated 3 times.

Prerequisites for the Bridging Transition (LVN or Paramedic to RN) program:

- ✓ **English 1301** must be completed with a "C" or better before applying for the nursing program.
- Anatomy & Physiology 1 (Biol 2401) must be completed with a "C" or better before applying for the nursing program. *
- ✓ Anatomy & Physiology 2 (Biol 2402) must be completed with a "C" or better. A&P2 can be enrolled in during the application cycle. The course must be successfully completed by the end of the application cycle semester. *
 - * Science prerequisites A&P1 (Biol 2401) & A&P2 (Biol 2402) must NOT have more than 1 "C" in the courses.
 - * Anatomy & Physiology courses expire after 5 years. Failed Anatomy & Physiology courses may only be repeated 3 times.
- ✓ Psyc 2314 Lifespan Human Growth and Development must be completed with a "C" or better before applying for the nursing program.

TEAS TESTING INFORMATION

TEAS requirements for RN:

The minimum score for the **TEAS RN** exam in English, Math, and Reading is a 58.7 and the Science with a minimum of 50.0.

TEAS requirements for Bridging Transition (VN or Paramedic to RN):

The minimum score for the **TEAS BRIDGING TRANSITION** in English, Math, Reading and Science is a 58.7.

- * TEAS exam scores expire after one year from completion.
- * TEAS exam can be repeated up to 4 times in a testing cycle.

ADDITIONAL TESTING FOR THE BRIDGING TRANSITION (LVN or Paramedic to RN) PROGRAM

* ATI Critical Thinking exam will be required for the Bridging Transition program. Scores above 50% will receive additional points added to their application. This exam can be scheduled with the TEAS exam.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT ENGLISH PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENTS

- If coming from an English-speaking country scores may be waived
- Non-US resident students are required to demonstrate English Proficiency by taking one of the following English language exams.

Evidence of proficiency on the English language is required and can be satisfied by submitting results from the:

- Test of English as a Foreign language (TOEFL)
- International English Language Testing Service (IELTS)
- Duolingo English Test (DET)
- Manchester Exam (MEXAM)
- or by completing the highest level in an English as a Second Language (ESL) program

Minimum score for the TOEFL is **550** (paper exam), **213** (computer exam), or **79** (internet-based exam), for **DET** the minimum score is **100**, for **MEXAM** the minimum score is **400**, and for **IELTS**, the minimum score is 6.5 for the academic version, general training results are not acceptable. The **TOEFL**, **DET**, **MEXAM**, and **IELTS** scores are only valid for 2 years.

Upon successful completion of the transition program articulated academic credit will be given for RNSG 1413 and RNSG 1441. The total program hours are 60.

Frequently Asked Questions

- 1. Q: What are the hours once in the nursing program?
 - A: Depending on which nursing program you attend the class days and time will vary.
- 2. Q: Can I work while in the nursing program?
 - A: We do not advise students to work while they are enrolled in our nursing program, however that is ultimately the student's choice. Nursing school workload is heavy and difficult so if you choose to work, please plan accordingly, and stay organized and on top of your schoolwork.
- 3. Q: Can I take the nursing classes online or at night?
 - A: No. We do not offer any of our nursing classes online, at night, or weekends. The Bridging Transition program does have some online/hybrid courses.
- 4. Q: Can I take more classes a semester or during summer to get ahead and finish the program earlier?

A: No. Our program is set up based on a strict curriculum and there are no variances allowed from that curriculum. The Bridging Transition program does attend classes during the summer.

- 5. Q: Will my classes from another college transfer to SPC?
 - A: All non-nursing courses that were taken at Regionally Accredited College/University should transfer with no problem, but you will need to check with the registrar to be sure. If you are trying to transfer nursing courses into our program from another nursing program, you will have to discuss that with the Director of our program. The Director must look at the program and will review the completed courses to see if they will align with our curriculum and program outcomes. Courses should not be older than 6 months. On average most nursing courses will not transfer into our program because most course work does not align with our curriculum.
- 6. Q: If I am currently enrolled in, or planning to take my prerequisites am I still eligible to apply to the program?
 - A: Yes. If a student has successfully completed English 1301 and Biology 2401 (Anatomy & Physiology 1) and is currently enrolled in Biology 2402 (Anatomy & Physiology II) at the time of application, they are eligible to apply to the ADN program. The Bridging Transition program all prerequisites must be completed or currently enrolled in prior application deadline.
